Curriculum Outline



Campbell High School Character – Courage – Respect – Responsibility

Description of Course:

Students who foresee music in their post-secondary plans and/or students with a strong interest in music should enroll. Students will develop their understanding of topics such as notation, intervals, chord theory, harmony and ear training. Students will also learn and apply skills in areas such as music history, composition, formal analysis, transposition and arrangement. The class will culminate in a public performance and exhibition of learning.

Suggested Instructional Strategies:

- **1. Lecture:** Teacher shares information regarding compositional techniques and music theory.
- 2. Group Work: Students work together on notation and composition projects, with teacher assistance/guidance.
- 3. Journal: Students write responses to musical listening exemplars, with teacher feedback.
- **4. Hands-On Learning:** Students will perform on musical instruments in order to comprehend musical concepts such as rhythm, pitch and duration of notes and rests.
- 5. Research: Students will locate, organize, and disseminate information regarding music.

Suggested Assessment Strategies:

- 1. Various quizzes and tests
- 2. Individual assessments
- 3. Ensemble critiques
- 4. Create, perform and evaluate various music compositions.
