The program incorporates Applied Behavioral Analysis as well as other methods of teaching children with developmental delays. Skills are taught in a 1:1 environment or in small groups. Generalization of mastered skills is worked on, as are increasing independence with tasks.

All students are integrated into their homeroom for as much of the day as possible with the support of a paraprofessional. They attend times such as circle time, art, gym, music, PE, lunch, recess, special activities, and fieldtrips. They may also be part of academic times of the day, if appropriate.
