Description of Course:

This class is designed to offer each student the chance to master the fundamentals of guitar. Aside from improving their ability to read music, students will learn basic chords, tuning and finger picking. Each student will have the opportunity to develop skills, compose, perform and record. No previous guitar experience is necessary. All you need is the desire to learn and your own guitar; acoustic preferred.

- **4. Hands-On Learning:** Students will perform on musical instruments in order to comprehend musical concepts such as rhythm, pitch and duration of notes and rests in a variety of settings including concerts and in classrooms.
- **5. Research:** Students will locate, organize, and disseminate information regarding music.
