COUNSELOR'S CORNER

How to Talk to Your Middle School Student about Self-Harming Behaviors:

It is important for us as parents and educators to be aware of the signs and symptoms of selfharming behaviors. If you suspect that your child may be engaging in self-harm, it is crucial to approach the topic with care and sensitivity. Here are some guidelines to help you navigate this difficult conversation:

1. Choose the right time and place: Find a quiet and comfortable environment where you can have an uninterrupted conversation with your child.

2. Be non-judgmental and supportive: Let your child know that you are there for them and that you want to understand their feelings.

3. Listen actively: Give your child the opportunity to express themselves without interruption. Avoid blaming or criticizing.

4. Seek professional help: If you suspect that your child is self-harming, it is important to reach out to a mental health professional who can provide guidance and support. If you feel as though you need additional support our team is here to help; *Kate Dichard, School Counselor grades 5&8, Emily MacDonald, School Counselor grades 6&7, Jocelyn Biedrzcki, School Social Worker, Greg Pantazis, Mental Health Counselor*
