Service

(Student Application) Service means seeing a need in the community (outside of family) and fulfilling it voluntarily. Service hours do not include activities associated with Campbell High School organizations or clubs, Sophomore projects, and paid employment. Service hours must be documented on the application with artifacts of the completed service and contact information of the organization / person that will verify their hours.
